



PR Audit Report

From January 1, 2022, through February 28, 2023, Creative Pinellas received 488 media placements, leading to 1,834,130,969 in media impressions for an advertising equivalency value of \$13,965,711.70 million dollars. Here are some slides that capture that information.

Localtopia

In February, in collaboration with VSPC we attended Localtopia. As our (Creative Pinellas) first large-scale community activation in some time it was wonderful to be embedded in the community. In talking with some of the attendees we learned that they are excited about the opportunities experience arts at the Gallery at Creative Pinellas and to see the new exhibitions.

One woman commented “I make visiting the Gallery and the gardens a must do on my list every month. . .” Another attendee mentioned that they “live close to Walsingham Park and they visit the gallery regularly now and enjoy the receptions” adding that she tells all her friends to visit too. During the festival Creative Pinellas was also able to do outreach with vendors, organizations and the community to let them know about the Arts Summer Camp Grant and Artist Grant programs.



Attendees were able to “experience the arts” in the Arts Coast by coloring in their own section of our beautiful 35 miles of sugar-sand-bliss with the GIANT Coloring Book sponsored by Visit St Pete Clearwater, featuring the Arts Navigator. Both adults and children enjoyed coloring on such a large scale. Other children and adults chose to take a pause at the coloring station and try out the Arts Navigator.

Brandee, from VSPC led the way at the activation as the

presenting sponsor for Localtopia and gave a shout out to the Arts Navigator powered by Creative Pinellas on the morning news. It was nice to listen to people share their excitement about the arts events and activities they saw when they used the Arts Navigator.

Creative Pinellas experienced high engagement in social media during Localtopia, a result of the foundation the team has been building.

We also connected with over 200 attendees about the Arts Navigator in Largo at the Gallery, the Botanical Gardens and Heritage Village and they gladly took more information and were excited to come and visit or continue to visit.

GALLERY AND RELATED ACTIVITIES

African American Heritage Celebration – Saturday March 25, 2023






Fire Sister Fly

Cuban American Artist Yolanda Sanchez' work continues to wow audiences at the gallery.



We are just beginning our drive to become

the hub for information about cultural arts experiences and opportunities in Pinellas County, pitching to the varied organizations for both hard copy literature as well as digital/video media. The official launch of the Visitor Center will be in July, but we are planning to keep the space open as we continue to make improvements in real time.

Student Exhibitions

A partnership with the Pinellas Public School District and the Clearwater Arts Alliance, artwork from students will be on view in the Gallery during Youth Art Month (YAM) from **March 4 – April 2, 2023**, with a reception on Sunday March 5.

Our Congressional Districts were changed this year and the Congressional District High School art show found itself without a home. Creative Pinellas stepped in and we will be displaying the student artwork from **April 12 – May 14, 2023** with a reception on Saturday, May 13.

After the show ends, the “Best of Show” artwork travels to Washington, DC to be displayed, with other congressional district winners, for one year in the Cannon Tunnel leading to the U.S. Capitol, and Award of Merit artworks are hung in the 13th District’s Office




Emerging Artist Exhibition 2023



Preliminary conversations with our 2023 Emerging Artists have been taking place as we prepare for this year’s Emerging Artist Exhibition. The exhibition opens with a reception on May 4 and runs through July 16, 2023, with artist talks scheduled throughout the run. This is a very interesting cohort of artists with many of them focused on the creation of installation art, i.e., large-scale, mixed-media constructions.

One of our Emerging Artist Grantees is director Patrick Arthur Jackson who is using the grant funds to produce and direct the play *61 Unused Pages* by Vincent Turell Durham. While a video of the play will be shown as part of the exhibition, the play will be performed live on Tuesday, April 25 at the Studio@620.



Art from the Sixth Judicial Circuit Adult Drug Court (Title TBA)

Opening Reception Wednesday, May 24, 2023, during National Drug Court Month.

The Drug Court is a court-supervised, comprehensive drug treatment court for non-violent defendants. A voluntary program, it involves frequent appearances before the drug court judge, substance abuse treatment, and random testing for substance abuse. To get part or all of the costs of supervision waived in Drug Court, defendants can participate in a variety of so-called challenges, including the fitness challenge, the no-smoking challenge, and the reading challenge.

One of the challenges instituted by current Drug Court Judge Todd is the "Art challenge" to create a self-reflective work of art. The created art hung up on the walls and on the shelves in Courtroom 10, home of drug court at the County Justice Center in Clearwater, runs the gamut from heart-breaking to inspirational. Working with the Court, we are reaching out to the artists to learn more about their journey and their experience creating their artworks. The result will be a community-based exhibit in the tradition of "The Things They Left Behind" that will use the arts to help put a face on the public health crisis of drug abuse and addiction that our community and country is experiencing. Thank you to Judge Todd and Commissioner Kathleen Peters for making the connection with Creative Pinellas and seeing the possibility of this exhibit.

2023 Emerging Artist Grant

The Emerging Artist Grantees are well on their way to preparing for the EAG exhibition opening **May 4th**.

A Emerging Artist Exhibition Home Page was created on the Creative Pinellas website where the grantees can easily review the dates to keep them on track for the EAG exhibition. Other pages on the website are the Emerging Artist Exhibition Artwork Manifest Submission and the Emerging Artist Exhibition Marketing Submission.

We are excited for the next conversations with the EAGs on **Wednesday, March 15**, where we will discuss "Your Journey to the Exhibition & Marketing Yourself for the Exhibition."

2023 Professional Artist Grant

We are now in the panel application review stage! Eighty-five out of ninety-six applications made it through the first round of applications.

We have an excellent panel for the PAG program. From educators in art, performers



to visual artists. We are excited for the upcoming live panel review scheduled for March 18, 9am to 1pm where ten professional artists will be awarded \$5000 and an additional \$5000 going to the Artist Laureate.

2023 Arts Summer Camp Grant

The Arts Summer Camp grant is ready to launch on Wednesday, March 1. This is the grant that sends Pinellas Youth to a session of arts summer camp. Now in its 5th year, it is one of our most successful programs.

The Marketing team has completed its marketing campaign, and the website is scheduled to be launched on Wednesday, March 1. Previous camp participants are starting to reach out to confirm the arts summer camp availability this 2023.

NEA GRANTS

We completed a “second” (lightning) round of NEA grants. Of our original award for regranteeing of \$500,000 with \$450,000 for regranteeing, we were able to distribute all but \$22,000. We reached out to the NEA with a proposal that we distribute “mini grants” of \$1,000 each, to non-profit arts organizations that



were often overlooked in the grant process. (Too small, too new, too unpracticed in the application process). Through an active grass root effort we reached out, focusing on organizations that often served under-resourced organizations and were able to approve 14 new grants including:

PARTNERSHIP ACTIVITIES

SPACEcraft

SPACEcraft programming is over and complete. What a wonderful public art activity that we had a chance to engage in and deliver. (Funded by BP Funds, courtesy of the BCC). We still have a few more things to do, and some good news.

- We have moved the SPACEcraft containers to the City of Largo's public works facility, where they are undergoing some maintenance and repair. This activity is included in our original budget with the County, as contingency.
- The SPACEcraft team is writing a final report, that will collect and archive the full 2 plus years of the project. (We keep encouraging them to produce a book!). This is also part of the original agreement.
- We received a \$25,000 grant from the city of Largo, and will use those funds to take the SPACEcraft containers and programming to Largo Central Park,



where we will offer SPACEcraft “analogous” programming through the summer.

- Mitzi Gordon (SPACEcraft coordinator) is moving to NYC in March.
- We have been working with her to identify to members of the SPACEcraft team who will take over coordination of the project for the summer
 - Scheduling activities
 - Managing the activities and space
- NOMAD Art Bus (Carrie Boucher) who has been the fiscal partner for SPACEcraft and also part of the team, will manage the project for us during its Largo visit.
- After that – the sky is the limit!
 - Board member Jason Hackenwerth has some ideas (already) and we will be working closely with him on next steps. Additionally:
 - Dead Garvin (and USFSP Vice Chancellor Christian Hardigree) have expressed interest sin engaging their students with the next version of this project
 - Jonathan Ogle from Pinellas Public Schools is also excited by the idea that we may be able to do something together

Public Works Signal Box Project

We received an unprecedented 80+ applications for our (brand new) signal box wrap project with Pinellas County Public Works. Because the numbers were so high, we extended the time period for our panel to review the application by about 3 weeks. We also changed our original plan – which was to do two cycles of 3 and 6, to choosing up to 9 from this first cycle (depending on the quality of the applications.)

In the past, for projects like this (the Rays Poster series, our murals) we received 15 – 25 applications. So, we had designed our review process and the two cycles with this in mind.

We don't know yet if this trend will be on-going or it is an anomaly. Either way, we are very excited about the community response.

Co. Starters

Creative Pinellas along with the Tampa Bay Innovation Center began the next STEAM powered by **CO.STARTERS Cohort #17** for its 10-week program held virtually on Zoom.

This program, which teaches artists the fundamentals of creating and running their arts business is an incredibly successful program in
