distinct projects, presented in tandem and collaboration. "Reiteration" by McCaman is a group of large scale sculptural pieces that use diverse textures, materials, and technology to create a multi-sensory and participatory experience for visitors.

"Reprise" by French, is an ongoing/developmental work



We Convene

Planning and outreach for the WE CONVENE Program, a series of 6 community discussions on key topics in the arts took off in January, with Marketing launching via email and social media, to promote the series as well as the first event on public art and placemaking.



Starting in February and continuing through the summer, the series will end with a community town hall in September to collectively share what has been discovered and to set the stage for next steps.

Each meeting will be from 8am -10am and will start with arrival/ networking for the first 30 minutes, followed by the introduction to some Pinellas County success stories that are working in the landscape of the specific meeting topic. FREE and open to the public at the Gallery at Creative Pinellas.

A keynote speaker will kick off the working session with an inspirational/aspirational presentation, followed by breakout discussions to understand key issues or needs, raise ideas and solutions to address those needs. The meeting will close with a call for participants interested in working on the topic to bring their findings together to be featured in a Town Art style meeting in September.

Other NEA Pinellas Recovers Grant

Marketing for the Pinellas Recovers Grant started in January to inform individual artists and arts and culture organizations that this opportunity was going to launch soon and to be prepared to participate.

Pinellas Recovers grants will help artists and nonprofit arts organizations recover from the effects of the Covid-related economic losses while responding to underserved communities.



Creative Pinellas was one of 24 local arts agencies nationwide selected to receive an American Rescue Plan grant for \$500,000 from the National Endowment for the Arts (NEA).

Pinellas Recovers is a one-year competitive grant program in addition to the annual Creative Pinellas Professional Artists and Emerging Artists grants. It will award the following:

- 21 Individual Artist project grants from \$2,500 \$10,000
- 25 Arts Organization operating grants from \$2,500 to \$50,000 (based on up to 10% of the organization's operating budget for 2019 to present)

Funds will

- help support jobs in the arts sector.
- keep the doors open to arts organizations.
- assist in the sector's response to and recovery from the COVID-19 crisis.
- provide access to arts experiences to underserved audience.
- support salaries, stipends to artists, marketing, promotion and other operating and/or direct project expenses.





WEBSITE NARRATIVE





Artist Laura Spencer adding a fresh touch of color to Lealman

This week's cold snap is trying hard to mess with Laura Spencer's Lealman District mural project.

Yet the artist, St. Pete born and bred, continues to bundle up, nearly every morning, to spend the daylight hours perched atop a rented green lift, making *Garden Variety* come to colorful life on the corrugated façade of Mother Kombucha's 1,700-square-foot 28th Street warehouse.

"It's a big project for a little small potato like me," laughs the heavily-layered muralist.

Her hope is that the expansive project will be wrapped up like a Christmas present by the end of the month. "Like any good artist, it's not done until somebody tells me to set my pencil down," Spencer says.
