# In The Gallery January 2023

## **Out of Eden**

January 19, 2023 - April 16, 2023

185 people attended the opening of Cuban American artist Yolanda Sánchez's natureinspired art exhibition.

Featuring paintings and textiles created using the traditional Korean Bojagi wrapping technique, her body of artwork is full of lush, vibrant colors that reflect the landscape surrounding the Gallery at Creative Pinellas and all of Pinewood Park.



The exhibition in the main gallery hall, and the two middle rooms, with an





interactive hands-on experience in the small gallery will be open to the public through April 16 with a hands-on fabric workshop being planned for March's Third Saturday.

We are hopeful that Yolanda will be able to join us for an artist talk in late March or early April before the show closes.

## **IMAGINE BLACKNESS:** ALTERNATE REALITIES AND COLLECTIVE DREAMING

January 19 – February 26, 2023

The exhibition has received much attention from the media and word of mouth. We received close to 300 reservations for the opening reception and artist talk on January 28 and the day brought 230 people to Creative Pinellas.





The logistics required the expertise of the entire CP team who brought their time and talents and energy to the project. We were able to fit 100+ guests into the auditorium and then set up overflow viewing via Livestream in the Gallery lobby and in Gallery E. (Thank you CEO Barbara St. Clair for suggesting this and Director of Tourism Products and Strategy, Kim DeVito for putting in the work to make it a reality.)

Based on their experimental Instagram project, IMAGINE BLACKNESS is a collaborative exploration of Blackness and Black representation through Algenerated images created by the collaborative team of artist **McArthur Freeman II** and sociologist **Elizabeth Hordge-Freeman**. This is the first time, outside of Instagram, that the Freeman's work has been on display and it has certainly struck a chord. Here is the description:

From a botanical paradise laden with richly hued figures to an otherworldly futuristic sci-fi cosmos,



this exhibition invites viewers to engage in the act of collective dreaming as a social intervention,



which moves beyond the reality of the present world to

(re)imagine and discover new ways

of seeing and being. Inspired by Black speculative fiction and Afro-Futurism, the project offers viewers interactive opportunities to question, inspire, and escape by engaging the viewers' own imaginations in the co-construction of the future and alternate worlds.



The Freemans will be leading a hands-on project in the Gallery during the Pinellas African American Heritage Celebration on Saturday, February 25, 2023.

## **Upcoming Exhibitions**

A partnership with the Pinellas Public School District and the Clearwater Arts Alliance, artwork from students will be on view in the Gallery during Youth Art Month (YAM) from March 4 – April 2, 2023.

Our Congressional Districts were changed this year and the Congressional District High School art show found itself without a home. Creative Pinellas stepped in and we will be displaying the student artwork from April 12 – May 14, 2023.

Preliminary conversations with our 2023 Emerging Artists have been taking place as we prepare for this year's Emerging Artist Exhibition. The exhibition opens with a reception on May 4 and runs through July 16, 2023 with artist talks scheduled throughout the run. This is a very interesting cohort of artists with many of them focused on the creation of installation art, ie, large-scale, mixed-media constructions. This year's exhibition should be a very compelling and unique experience for our visitors!

housewife inside. She mistakes the Black housekeeper as the lady of the house.

## GRANTS

## 2023 Emerging Artist Grant

The Emerging Artist Grantees had their first meet-up and conversation on Monday, January 30. For their first meet-up, we did something a little different. We invited the mentors to the meet-up and shared in the conversation with their grantees. It turned out to be a fantastic time. The grantees introduced themselves and their mentors. They each spoke about their current granting experience for this grant period. Our feel-good moment was when the grantees and mentors spoke of their excitement of being matched together and how each has learned from the other.



The topic of discussion: "what are some of the challenges you're facing" and "do you need help, and what help can you provide to others?"

For a few of the artists, the challenge was thinking big. Creative Pinellas Marketing Associate Ketsy Ruiz spoke to them about thinking big and using their spaces to produce larger pieces from a previous Emerging Artist Grantee standpoint.

The Creative Pinellas joined in the conversation and gave tips and examples from previous exhibitions to help the grantees with fresh ideas.

Grantees and the Creative Pinellas team are excited about the following conversation that will take place **on Wednesday, March 15**, where we will discuss "Marketing yourself for the exhibition."

### 2023 Professional Artist Grant

We have up to 120 applications submitted within a week and a half from the grant closing date. One more workshop is scheduled for February 6 from noon to 1 pm. The Grant Manager stated the applicants have been reaching out to me to ensure they don't miss the workshop or if they can go back to review the past workshops. After emailing the applicants to



provide an update for the grant timeline, Charlene said this grant period seems to have been very active with questions and letting me know they are still working on their applications. I feel good about that.



#### ARTWorks : Signal Box Project 2023

#### CALL TO ARTIST for ARTWorks Signal Box Project 2023 (ROUND 1) OVERVIEW:

Creative Pinelias and Pinelias County are joining together to create the 2023 ARTWorks Signal Box Project that encourages artists to submit original artwork to beautify Finelias County by transforming the traffic signal control boxes into a collection of public art.

The purpose of traffic signal cabinet art is to deter graffiti vandalism on transportation infrastructure, beautify the rights-of-way and community, and support Pinellas County as an arts destination. The use of art on public infrastructure has been shown to prevent graffiti vandalism in the County, demonstrating that "Public Art Works."

Three Pinelias County Artists will be selected based on the portfolio work submitted, concepts for their proposed design and their resume as a working artist in Pinelias County. After the selection process, the artists will create the artwork, that will be reproduced as a vinyl wrap and applied to traffic signal boxes throughout the County.

## **SPACEcraft**

SPACEcraft completed Its final session under the auspices of the Creative Pinellas grant, with both containers coming to and offering programming at Azalea Park in St. Petersburg, FL.

But some good new! Thanks to a \$25,000 grant from the City of Largo, we are In conversation to bring both containers to Central Park this spring.

In the meantime, we are storing and doing some maintenance of the containers In Largo, In a space managed by Largo public works.

We also have reached out to USFSP, and they have agreed to store the containers

once we have completed the programming In Largo, while we determine how we might use them next.

## Co. Starters

Creative Pinellas along with the Tampa Bay Innovation Center opened for enrollment STEAM powered by CO.STARTERS Cohort #17 for its 10-week program held virtually on Zoom.

This program, which teaches artists the fundamentals of creating and running their arts business is an incredibly successful program in partnership with the Tampa Bay Innovation Center.




