# **Arts Annual**

Tropical Storm Nicole kept us from having The Party to formally open the Arts Annual 2022 exhibition, but the exhibition opened the following day with a group of artists talks. From 12:30 – 5:00pm, *Nerverne Covington, Patricia Kluwe Derderian, Jim Gigurtsis Emily Stehle, Judy Vienne, Christina Bertsos, Saumitra Chandratreya*, and *Mark Mitchell* presented information about themselves and their art to engaged groups of patrons.

The audiences and the artists felt it was a very successful day.

Total November visitors were 1300. Total November Arts Annual sales was \$2,258.



# PATH TO UNITY



James Weldon Johnson – the first Black person admitted to The Florida Bar through an individual examination who also wrote the hymn "Lift Every Voice and Sing" in 1900 that became referred to as the Black national anthem

Creative Pinellas opened The Florida Bar's Path to Unity exhibit on November 30, 2022. The traveling exhibit honors attorneys in Florida who exemplify the values of The Florida Bar's mission for equality. This program was created to engage and educate lawyers, future lawyers, and students on the Florida Bar's history and to help them understand their power to have a transformative and lasting impact on underrepresented communities, our rights, and our society. Over the past year, Path to Unity has traveled around the state, displaying portraits of the legendary lawyer painted by commissioned student artists. A CLE course for lawyers featuring living legend *Larry Smith, Judge Charles Williams*, and St Petersburg ASALH president will take place on Thursday December 8. The reception has

been underwritten by Burns White and Massey Law. The portraits will be on display through December 15, 2022.

The esteemed lawyers being featured in the exhibit include:

- **Anna Brenner Meyers** the founding member and first president of the Florida Association for Women Lawyers
- Judge Mario Goderich the first president of the Cuban American Bar Association and the first Hispanic/Cuban American to hold all of his judicial posts
- Larry D. Smith a tireless advocate for the LGBTQ community and the first openly gay member to serve on the Supreme Court Commission of Florida
- James Kracht a blind and fierce advocate for blind lawyers in Florida and past president of the Florida Council for the Blind, who helped organize The Florida Bar's first CLE seminar about lawyers with disabilities
- James Weldon Johnson the first Black person admitted to The Florida Bar through an individual examination who also wrote the hymn "Lift Every Voice and Sing" in 1900 that became referred to as the Black national anthem






